- Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects

 (GGP) is a financial assistance scheme offered by the
 Government of Japan for small-scale development projects
 designed to meet the diverse socio-economic needs of
 developing countries.
- By supporting community level socio-economic development projects which address Basic Human Needs (BHNs), the program directly contributes towards improvements at a grassroots level in various fields including health, education, and skill training as well as social welfare sectors.

Objective

Make direct impact on the wellbeing of people at a grassroots level


Improve **living standards** and **welfare** of grassroots communities in Pakistan

Status in Pakistan

Since 1989 it has supported more than **400 projects** in Pakistan with a
contribution of more than **2.9 billion Japanese Yen** till date.

Notice: GGP does **Not Support** federal government bodies, universities, private profit-making institutions and industrial corporations (factories, business, farms, etc.).

For an Organization:

A minimum of **2** years experience in implementing development projects after registration.

For Application

- Project feasibility
- Sustainability
- Gender mainstreaming
- Appropriateness and cost-effectiveness of requested amount:
- Necessity, urgency and impact of the proposed project

Grant Limit

Grant Amount

 Up to 10 million JPY in principle, financed in USD, depending upon the exchange rate.

Grant Duration

- Approved Projects must be completed within 1 year of the date of grant contract
- For multiple year duration, project is divided into phases and for each phase, a new application is required

Ineligible Items

Common Mistakes:

- Staff Salaries
- Running Costs
- Purchase of personal computers and books.
- Payment for VAT, customs and duties, registration/license/certification fees etc.;

When to Apply

- There are **No** application **deadlines**.
- An organization can apply any time throughout the year.
- Applicants can submit two projects, but only one application can be approved at a time.

How to Apply

- Read the guidelines thoroughly.
- Download the application form available on the **Website**.
- Following the application guidelines, fill out the application form in typed form.
- Enclose all necessary documentation with the application form.
- Send the completed application and all supportive documents by post to

the Consulate-General of Japan in Karachi;

Essential Documents

- Estimates for all equipment and construction costs from **3** suppliers and/or general contractors/auditors
- Legal Registration
- Audit and accounting reports (last 2 years)
- Maps of the project site
- Blueprints and construction plans





- Public-Private Partnership (PPP)
- Recycling
- Micro-credit
- Partnership with Local Governments of Japan

Public-Private Partnership (PPP)

- In cooperation with Japanese companies
- Assumed to be cooperation in CSR activities carried out by corporations and BOP businesses, etc.

Recycling

- Second-hand equipment from Japan is reused in recipient countries
- Assistance is provided through GGP mainly to cover costs incurred in the repair and transportation of the recycled products.

Micro-Credit

- This project provides assistance for micro credit financing.
- Maximum grant amount: **20 million yen**
- The provision of small amounts of unsecured funds to the poor who have no means of securing funds and limited access to funds.

 By harnessing the technology and know-how possessed by Japanese local governments that are promoting overseas expansion in areas that contribute to the development of developing countries.
