## JAPANESE SUPPORTED INTENSIVE CARE UNIT EQUIPMENTS COMPLETED WORTH US\$ 111,129 IN KARACHI

The Government of Japan completed the project of equipping Afzaal Memorial Thalassemia Foundation with intensive care unit equipments in Karachi, worth US\$ 111,129 (approx. Rs. 9.5 million) under the scheme of the Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP), on February 29, 2012.

The inauguration ceremony took place at Thalassemia Center in Karachi, with the presence of Mr. Masaharu Sato, Consul General of Japan and Dr. Asim Qidwai, C.E.O. of Afzaal Memorial Thalassemia Foundation. The Grant has been utilized for the intensive care unit equipments to provide complimentary treatment for thalassemia and its complications which could lead to death or significant morbidities.
