JAPANESE SUPPORTED PRIMARY SCHOOL COMPLETED

WORTH US\$ 70,821 IN KARACHI, SINDH

KARACHI: March 2, 2011

The Government of Japan completed "Al-Khair School" at New Karachi, Sindh, worth US\$ 70,821

(approx. Rs.6 million) in collaboration with Idara Al-Khair Welfare Society under the scheme of the

Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP), on March 2, 2011.

The inauguration ceremony has been conducted at the Al-Khair School at New Karachi, with the presence

of Acting Consul General of Japan, Mr. Toshikazu Isomura. The school facility has been extended from

the Japanese Consulate to Mr. Mohammad Mazahir, President of the Idara Al-Khair Welfare Society

(NGO). A number of students, boys and girls and local people also attended the ceremony and applauded

the philanthropic efforts of Japan and the Pakistani NGO.

Japanese government and the NGO had agreed and signed on this carefully selected education development

project on February 24, 2010, and since then both parties have made tremendous efforts to set up an

educational institution with the purpose to help more local people to access free and quality education.
