Ladies and Gentlemen.

Assalam Alaikum.

It gives me a great pleasure to attend this grant contract signing ceremony for

"The Project for Provision of Medical Equipment for Pediatric Intensive Care

Unit to the Indus Hospital" today.

The grant contract being signed today for the purchase of medical equipment

for pediatric intensive care unit of Indus Hospital in Karachi amounts to about 9

million rupees.

As part of the Official Development Assistance to developing countries, the

Government of Japan offers a scheme to support non-governmental

organizations and community based organizations that are working specifically

in the social development sector. Known as the Grant Assistance for Grassroots

Human Security Projects (GGP), it provides flexible and timely support to small-

scale development projects, which aim to improve the social well-being of the

people at the grassroots level.

Since 1989, Japan has been implementing this grant scheme for about 350

projects throughout Pakistan and the Consulate-General of Japan in Karachi

also initiated this scheme of assistance in 2009 and this project is the sixteenth

project.

The Indus Hospital since 2007 has been providing health care services to the

people living in Sindh for free of charge. It has recently set up a new Pediatric

Unit to provide better child health services.

The grant of about 9 million rupees will cover the cost of four ventilators, two

infusion pumps, two syringe pumps, etc. These equipment is expected to

provide significantly improved treatment services to spatialized children which

will be installed in the new Pediatric Unit and I believe that this project will

greatly contribute to upgrading of health care services to the children in Sindh.

I would like to conclude my remarks by saying that the assistance that we are

providing through this project is a token of friendship from the people of Japan

and I believe that it will further strengthen our friendly relationship between

Japan and Pakistan.
