I visited the Arakai elementary school and saw the superb performance of the nursery school kids and the Taiko Drum Performers Tatsumi Kai at the community Hall. Not to mention that I also take part in the cultural event in which each country perform their respective activities and also practice playing the drums myself. I was extremely impressed by the Japanese education system and the dedication of the teachers to educate the young generation and the also the dedication of the children to learn with their sincere hearts. The children there were wonderful and were extremely happy to meet us. I attend Calligraphy and Origami classes with them and I learn from them these arts which I have never done before in my entire life.

The performance by the nursery kids was so perfect that I have nothing to say but amazing. The Taiko drum performance was extremely good and flawless. Their performance shows the level of their skills and how much they had to practice to reach their level. I am saying this, since I also got the chance to practice the Taiko drum with the help of an Instructor and I was having difficulty to continue drumming for more than few minutes. It requires real skills and commitment.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> arrived and we had to take part in a workshop to prepare an action plan based to our experience. The workshop gives me the chance to learn about teamwork even further. After the preparation of action plan, a presentation was delivered by each teams about the learning experience and their future action based on those actions.

Then the final day came. We left Minamiaizu in the morning to go to Asakusa, Tokyo. It was a moment of happiness for me to come to such a nice and welcoming place and yet I also felt sadness to leave after such a short period. The departure from the lodgings was again in the bus to the railway station and again the journey was a sight to behold. From the station, the journey toward Asakusa began in the Tokyo Skytree Chartered train. This is also a wonderful experience to travel from the beautiful country side to the right beside the base of Tokyo Skytree. Tokyo Skytree is a must watch sight.

In Asakusa, we visited the ancient Buddhist temple and Shinto shrine. We also got the chance to do last minute shopping there. We also got the chance to Visit Akihabara and Ginza. But the time too short to enjoy it fully, but I still tried to enjoy it as much as I can. And then, the day of the final departure to Pakistan comes too quickly, if you ask me.
